



For all pet guardians, keeping their companions healthy is

always a priority, however sometimes the cost of care can be a challenge. To ensure regular vet visits are within reach of all Frederick County residents, the Frederick County Humane Society (FCHS) established the Well Care Assistance Program, made possible by the Banfield Charitable Trust and private donations.

The Well Care Assistance Program offers residents on a limited income basic vet care for their companion animals. For \$25, FCHS will provide a \$175 voucher that can be used at participating veterinarians towards a well care exam, vaccines, and/or tests, and allows pet guardians and their doctors to determine which services will best benefit their furry friend. Qualified applicants can apply once per calendar year for up to two pets.

The maximum income for program participation is \$26,000 for a household of one; \$35,000 for a household of two; and \$43,000 for a household of three or more. Income from all household occupants is taken into consideration to determine the grant award.
